THIS BILL

This bill would require all state agencies, including Franchise Tax Board (FTB), to provide a printed copy of any required report to the Legislative Counsel and an electronic copy of any required report to both the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the Assembly. In addition, this bill would require all state agencies to submit an electronic copy of the summary of any required report to each member of the house or houses of the Legislature, as appropriate. In addition to other reports, the bill would require Legislative Counsel to remove specifically identified reports from the list of reports due from the FTB that are obsolete, as defined.
