This bill would define the minimum information to be provided in a security breach notification.

The June 22, 2010, amendments would make changes related to entities covered under the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act. The August 2, 2010, amendments made a technical correction. The amendments do not impact the department’s programs and operations or state income tax revenue. The department’s analysis of the bill as introduced February 18, 2010, still applies.
