SUBJECT: State Government Information Technology/Statutory Codification Changes Made Necessary By Governor's Reorganization Plan No. 1 Of 2009 (GRP 1).

Assembly Bill 2408 (Smyth), as enacted on September 28, 2010, made the following changes to laws impacting the Franchise Tax Board:

Government Code sections 11534, 11546, 11548.5, 11549, 11549.1, and 11549.5 are amended; Government Code sections 11546.1, 11546.2, and 11546.3 are added.

This act codifies GRP 1, along with Executive Orders S-03-10 and S-20-04, and also does, in part, the following:

1. Renames the Office of the State Chief Information Officer (OCIO) to the California Technology Agency (CTA) and the position of the State Chief Information Officer (SCIO) to the Secretary of California Technology and imposes additional duties on both regarding state information technology governance and implementation.
2. Transfers all aspects of the Division of Telecommunications from the Department of DGS to the CTA and creates the positions of chief information officer and information security officer in various state agencies.
3. Transfers the Department of Technology Services from the State and Consumer Services Agency to the CTA.
4. Eliminates the Office of Information Security and Privacy Protection and creates the Office of Information Security within the CTA and the Office of Privacy Protection in the State and Consumer Services Agency.
5. Changes the sunset date on the provisions establishing the OCIO from January 1, 2013, to January 1, 2015.
6. Makes other technical, clarifying, and conforming changes.

This act is effective on January 1, 2011, and is operative as of that date.

This act will not require any additional reports by the department to the Legislature.
