**SUBJECT:** California Breast Cancer Research Fund/ Minimum Contribution Amount for Calendar Years 2014 and 2015 Shall be Equal to the Amount for 2013 Calendar Year

**SUMMARY**

This bill would temporarily suspend the annual adjustment of the minimum contribution amount requirement for the California Breast Cancer Research voluntary contribution fund (Fund).

**RECOMMENDATION**

No position.

**SUMMARY OF AMENDMENTS**

The May 8, 2013, amendments added coauthors and language that would decrease the temporary suspension of the minimum contribution adjustment from four to two years.

As a result of the amendments, the "This Bill" section as provided in the department's analysis of the bill as introduced February 22, 2013, has been revised. In addition, the "Support/Opposition" section has been updated. The remainder of the analysis still applies. The "Fiscal Impact" and "Economic Impact" sections are restated for convenience.

**ANALYSIS**THIS BILL

This bill would temporarily suspend the annual adjustment of the minimum contribution amount and allow the Fund to remain on the return through the 2015 calendar year, as long as the Fund continues to meet the 2013 calendar year minimum contribution amount of \$371,724.

The annual adjustment of the minimum contribution requirement would resume in the 2016 calendar year.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

This bill would not impact the department's costs.
