SUBJECT: Emergency Food for Families Fund/ Extend Operation Indefinitely

SUMMARY

This bill would eliminate the minimum contribution requirement and the repeal date for the voluntary contribution Emergency Food for Families Fund (Fund).

RECOMMENDATION

No position.

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENTS

The April 16, 2013, amendment repealed the provisions of law related to minimum contribution amount and repeal date for the Fund allowing the Fund to remain on the return indefinitely.

As a result of the amendments, the "Technical Considerations" as discussed in the department's analysis of this bill as introduced January 16, 2013, have been resolved and the "This Bill," section has been revised. In addition, the "Economic Impact" and the "Support/Opposition" sections have been updated. The remainder of the analysis still applies. The "Fiscal Impact" section is restated for convenience.

ANALYSISTHIS BILL

This bill would eliminate the Fund's repeal date; thereby allowing the Fund to remain on the personal income tax return indefinitely.

Additionally, this bill would eliminate the minimum contribution requirement and the FTB's obligation to report the estimated minimum contribution requirement to the State Department of Social Services.

FISCAL IMPACT

This bill would not significantly impact the department's costs.
