SUBJECT: State Agencies Notify California Residents of Any Breach of Security of System/Personal Information Includes User Name or Email Address in Combination with Password or Security Question and Answer

SUMMARY

This bill would expand the type of personal information acquired that triggers a notification to a California resident if the security of the information was compromised.

RECOMMENDATION

No position.

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENTS

The April 15, 2013, amendments made additional changes to the definition of "personal information" and make other nonsubstantive, technical changes.

As a result of the amendments, the "This Bill" section of the department's analysis of this bill as introduced December 14, 2013, has been revised. In addition, the "Support/Opposition" section has been updated. The remainder of the analysis still applies. The "Fiscal Impact," and the "Economic Impact," sections have been restated for convenience.

ANALYSIS**THIS BILL**

This bill would add the data elements "user name or email address, in combination with a password or security question and answer that would permit access to an online account" to the definition of "personal information".

FISCAL IMPACT

This bill would not impact the department's costs because the provisions of the bill are consistent with the department's current practices.
