



# CalEITC Comparison By County

Tax Year 2016 So Far Vs. Tax Year 2015 As Of Same Time Last Year

## Overview:

The Franchise Tax Board (FTB) today corrected the number of filers receiving the cash-back California Earned Income Tax Credit (CalEITC), as well as the amount of money issued so far this tax season.

As of March 11, 2017, the total number of taxpayers receiving CalEITC was 188,586, a 5 percent decrease from the same time last year. As of March 12, 2016, 197,561 taxpayers had received the credit.

As of March 11, 2017, the total amount of CalEITC issued was \$111,540,481, a 4 percent decrease from the same time last year. As of March 12, 2016, \$115,998,646 in CalEITC money was issued.

<sup>5</sup> Data listed in the "OTHER" row refer to taxpayers who filed with out-of-state addresses, yet lived in California for more than six months during the tax year. Also included are taxpayers who did not report a valid ZIP code.
