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## SUMMARY

This bill would define “encrypted” for Sections 1798.29 and 1798.82 of the Civil Code.

## RECOMMENDATION

## SUMMARY OF AMENDMENTS

The May 28, 2015, amendments removed a provision requiring a business, state, or local agency that is required to issue a security breach notification to inform the Attorney General of the date of the discovery of the breach. Except for the “This Bill” section, the remainder of the department’s analysis of the bill as amended March 26, April 23, May 5, and May 13, 2015, still applies.

## THIS BILL

This bill, for purposes of determining when a person, business, or, state or local agency is required to disclose a system security breach, would define “encrypted” as rendered unusable, unreadable, or indecipherable to an unauthorized person through a security technology or methodology generally accepted in the field of information security.

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
